



AAH Initiatives Fund: For Teaching, Learning and Widening Participation

Information

The AAH Initiatives Fund offers financial support up to £500 for AAH-related activities or research projects that promote and develop teaching, learning and widening participation in art history. The fund is available to both individual and institutional members seeking financial assistance with activities or events that contribute to or reflect AAH commitments in supporting teaching, learning and widening participation.

The AAH is a charitable organisation. It was established in 1974 to support and promote the study and development of art history. The AAH represents the interests of those involved in all aspects of the discipline within a professional and/or research capacity.

Guidelines

AAH Initiatives Fund assistance can only be sought by and offered to current AAH members.

Funding will only be offered for activities or events related to art history teaching, learning and widening participation. These could take the form of, but are not restricted to, conferences, workshops, discussion fora, online publication, and other activities focussing on teaching, learning and/or widening participation.

Funding can be sought (up to £500) for specific aspects of the activity or event (catering, room hire, keynote fees, travel and subsistence costs, editorial expenses etc.). The amount sought has to be clearly identified as a breakdown of costs in the application form. Teaching relief will not be covered by this fund.

The AAH will only usually offer financial assistance if additional funding is in place or has been sought for the activity or event.

AAH Initiatives Fund applications must be complete and returned in full and include: details of the event, an accurate breakdown of costs or predicted expenditure and income, and clear evidence of planning.

Successful applications will be required to acknowledge the AAH by including the AAH logo on any printed and online material relating to the funded project or event

If you are offered funding you will be required to provide material in the form of a detailed report on or filming of the event or activity. This will contribute to the building of an AAH online resource on and depository for teaching, learning and widening participation in art history. This material, together with proof of actual expenditure, will be due within 8 weeks of completion of the activity. The form of this material needs to be clearly stated in the application.

The AAH Executive Committee and Board of Trustees meet four times a year to assess funding applications. Meetings usually take place in January, April, June and September.
